Graduation Requirements

- Bulleted on the "Work in Progress" section of the transcript.
- Must earn credit in all classes bulleted to participate in graduation.
- GPA is printed in the GPA Summary. SC schools use the SC UGP GPA and rank.
- Honor Graduate—Final GPA of 4.0 or top 10% of the graduating class. Recognized with gold cords at graduation.

Your Plans

- Indicated on your transcript
- Information taken from your IGP conference
 - Work or Military
 - 2-Year School
 - Includes 2 year transfer option
 - 4-Year School
 - Includes additional requirements

Destination: Work or Military

- Military—speak with recruiters when they are available during lunch.
- Plan to take the ASVAB-Oct. 18 @ GHS (sign up in Student Services)
- Julie Rojek is our Career Specialist.
 - Co-Ops and Internships
 - Job interview skills
 - Resume preparation--Crew activity
 - Michelin Scholars

Destination: Two-Year College

- Transfer Programs vs. Career Programs
- Take entrance exam required by the school. Check with your college/program to see if other tests are recommended.

Watch for MTC Senior Days/College Night

Destination: Four Year College

- Additional Four-Year College requirements are indicated on the transcript.
- Take ACT or SAT. Register for a Fall administration.

You may qualify for a fee waiver. See Ms.
 Berry with questions.

Consider joining Educational Talent Search.

SAT

■ Cost: \$45

Register on-line at <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> The essay is now optional. Check with your college to see if it is needed.

 Score reports can be sent to 4 colleges without charge—take advantage of this.

ACT

- \$39.50 if no writing test; \$56.50 with writing test. Check with your specific colleges of interest.
- Register online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
- Score reports can be sent to 4 colleges without charge.

Applying to College

- Research Possible Colleges
 - Internet Searches/Naviance
 - Ed Op Fair--October 26
 - College Visits
 - Open Houses
 - Campus Tours
 - 2 days are excused for official college visits. You must present a statement to the GHS attendance office from the college to verify your visit.

Applying to College

Complete an application

- Online applications are preferred by colleges.
- Don't let cost keep you from applying.

SAT/ACT scores will usually need to be sent directly from the testing center.

Apply now even if you plan to take an entrance exam at a later date.

College Application Day--Friday, October 28

Parchment

- Students request transcripts for college applications electronically through *Parchment*. (<u>www.parchment.com</u>) Step-by-step instructions are available in Student Services.
- No transcript fee for most SC colleges.
- Possible \$3-5 fee for out-of-state colleges.

Deadlines

Check college websites for deadlines.

Recommendations

- A few colleges (and many scholarships) will ask for letters of recommendation.
- Contact your references early—allow them at least two weeks to write your letter.
- Carefully select references—choose someone who can comment on your positive characteristics.
- Provide a brag sheet or resume to assist your reference.

Action points for college application:

- Apply online
- Request transcript from Parchment
- Send SAT/ACT scores from the testing agency
- If applicable, mail recommendations to admissions office

College Athletes

- You may be required to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center.
- Registration is online at www.eligibilitycenter.org
- You need to request your final transcript to be sent to the NCAA Eligibility Center so that you will be cleared to play.

Palmetto Fellows

 Score 1200 (Reading + Math) on SAT or 27 on ACT, 3.5 minimum GPA at the end of the junior year, top 6% rank in class at the end of sophomore, junior or senior year.

OR

Score 1400 On SAT or 32 ACT and a 4.0 GPA.

\$6,700 in the first year with a possibility of enhancement

State Supported Scholarships

LIFE Scholarship--No Application

Four-Year college--two out of three qualifiers

3.0 FINAL GPA

top 30% of graduating class

1100 on SAT or 24 on ACT

Two-Year college

3.0--FINAL GPA

Up to \$5,000 in the first year

State Supported Scholarships

- HOPE Scholarship--No Application
 - Only available at Four-Year colleges
 - 3.0 Final GPA\$2,800 for the first academic year
- Lottery Tuition Assistance Program
 - Only available at Two-Year schools
 - Must complete a FAFSA
 Award money varies by academic year.

Institutional Awards

Awarded by the college after admittance.

 May require an additional application. Check with your college.

Applying early can help!

Federal Financial Aid

 Must complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

■ Financial Aid Night--Monday, October 24. You may bring your own device.
